## COMMUNITY HERITAGE GRANT WIN

The annual Community Heritage Grants were announced at the National Library of Australia in Canberra on 30 October, 2018.

This year, grants worth \$367,470 were distributed to 60 community groups and organisations from around Australia to assist in the identification and preservation of community owned but nationally significant heritage collections. The



Australasian Pentecostal Studies Centre has been awarded \$2475 for a disaster preparedness training workshop which is a vital step in ensuring the long-term preservation of our precious collection. The workshop will equip participants with an industry-standard approach to the development of a Disaster Preparedness Plan and provide training in significance assessment; reducing risk and prioritisng actions; response and recovery plans; salvage procedures and practical disaster response.

In the past, items in our collection have been subject to damage due to natural disaster, so the opportunity for grantfunded training in this area is vital.

CHG is managed by the National Library. It is funded by the Australian Government through the Department of Communications and the Arts; the National Archives of Australia; the National Film and Sound Archive; the National Museum of Australia and the National Library.
