Please note that the Ethics Application Form may vary according to the nature of your project. If you are doing research with participants under the age of 18 years, a section on Research with Minors will appear. If you are doing research overseas, a section on Research Outside Australia will appear. If all your participants will be aged 18 years or over and are living in Australia, these sections will not appear.

Depending on the nature of your research, the Ethics Application Form may require that you submit a number of documents from you, such as:

1. Permission letter to relevant organisations for doing research;
2. Advertising flyers for recruiting participants;
3. Agreement with assistant researchers who may see confidential data;
4. Information Sheet about the research;
5. Consent Form for participants to complete;
6. Surveys; and
7. Interview schedules.

You will see in this Sample Application Form references to such documents which have been downloaded as part of the Application. These additional sample documents, as relevant to this application, have been gathered and added as appendices. See the document ‘Requirements for Ethics Application Forms’ for templates.

This form is provided to enable easy applications to the Alphacrucis Human Research Ethics Committee for such approval.

If your research only uses data or information that has been previously collected with its own ethical approval (such as censuses, past surveys) or data that is publicly available (such as blogs publicly posted on the Internet), then ethics approval is not needed and you do not need to complete this form.

If you are doing research within an organisation solely for the use of that organisation, such as seeking feedback from students on their experiences of their studies or feedback from staff, no ethical approval is needed as long as that research is not going to be made public. If it will be made public, even in summary forms, ethics approval should be sought.

Note: For HDR Candidates, Confirmation of Candidature must be passed before applying for ethics approval.

The survey will be entirely anonymous, posted back to me in provided post-paid envelopes. Interviews will be undertaken in a counselling room at the church. All details of the individual will be removed from notes and recordings following the interview. The list of interviewees and those who have asked for a report will be kept in locked storage separately from the data itself.

After the Collection of Data

While the research is in progress, the data will be stored on my own computer which is locked with passwords and which is kept securely in home. All of this data will be in a de-identified form.

Following the completion of the research, all data will be placed on a CD-Rom in a locked cabinet at Alphacrucis College.

How will the data be used? How will you ensure the confidentiality of the participants when it is used, for example, in theses or publications? *

The data will be used in the publication of articles. Only generalised results will be reported and in a form whereby neither the church nor individuals will be able to be identified.

What benefits do you expect from the research? Are there benefits for the participants? How will you ensure the participants receive some benefits? Note: It is usual to offer the participants a short report. *

This study will provide more information regarding the ways that churches may both motivate and engage people in voluntary activities. Participants will be offered a short report and a longer report will be provided for the churches involved. A report will also be sent to the denomination to which these two churches belong. I also plan to use the information in some workshops for church leaders.

If, at any time, you do not wish to answer a question, you can simply say 'Pass' and we will move on. It is not anticipated that you will find any of the questions sensitive or difficult to answer. There are no right or wrong answers. I am simply interested in your thoughts: your experiences, insights and your opinions. If you wish to withdraw your participation, you may do so up to 2 weeks after the interview.

All information gathered from participants will be kept confidentially. While it must be kept for 7 years for legal reasons, it will be kept in locked cupboards at Alphacrucis. Only general patterns from this research will be reported in my thesis and in any other articles or publications based on this research.
