



The Diploma of Business is a stand-alone one year course and a potential pathway into the full Bachelor of Business program. The Core subjects introduce key aspects of Business Communication, Marketing, Accounting & Bookkeeping, and Project Management, all within an ethical framework and Christian worldview. Bachelor of Business

The Bachelor of Business provides foundational business theory and skills with the option of specialising (majoring) in either Accounting or Leadership & Management. Degree subjects cover topics such as marketing, financial reporting, decision-making, and entrepreneurship – preparing you for a range of roles in your future business career. Be equipped with a strong ethical framework to make a positive impact in the world of business.

Diploma of Arts

This one-year course is an entry pathway into various Bachelor level courses at AC, particularly for students with an IELTS lower than 6.5 but interested in pursuing the Bachelor of Applied Social Science.

The course covers core academic and humanities subjects. Upon successful completion, students will be able to gain credit towards the Bachelor of Applied Social Science or a range of other AC Bachelor level courses.

Do you want to make a difference in your community and on society? Do you have a deep desire to help people? The Bachelor of Applied Social Science trains and equips you to assist others in a professional and caring manner, based on evidence-based interventions and best-practice principles. You can choose to specialise in either counselling, chaplaincy & pastoral care, youth work, community work or crosscultural community work, with course content and experience meeting appropriate industry requirements. This course is accredited by the Australian Counselling Association (ACA).

Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood and Primary)

The Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood and Primary) is a course designed to meet the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) standards for early childhood teaching and NESA requirements for primary teacher registration. This course equips students for careers as a teacher for early childhood teaching and all primary school year levels. In addition to developing general skills in critical thinking, problem-solving, teamwork, and communication, graduates will be equipped with theoretical knowledge in curriculum development and pedagogy, to equip them for early childhood or primary classroom teaching.

130 credit points of Education Subjects + 150 credit points of Curriculum Subjects + 40 credit points of Professional Experience (80 days)

Bachelor of Education (Primary)

The Bachelor of Education (Primary) is a course designed to meet the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers at the undergraduate teacher level. This course equips you for provisional registration as a teacher for all primary school year levels and is accredited by TEQSA and NESA. It provides a core of pedagogy in each of the Key Learning Areas (KLAs) and professional experience. This course is for people who sense a calling to primary school teaching.



Bachelor of Education (Secondary)

The Bachelor of Education (Secondary) is a course designed to meet the Graduate Teacher Standard Descriptors, equipping graduates for provisional registration as teachers in high schools. This course provides a core of pedagogy for your area of specialisation and professional experience. Students can study their teaching specialisations from the following learning areas: The Arts, English, Health and Physical Education, Humanities and Social Sciences, Mathematics, Digital Technologies, and Religious Studies.

Bachelor of Theology

The Bachelor of Theology is a three-year degree offering specialisations including Ancient Languages or Christian Studies. This course will equip you for teaching, preaching, and senior leadership roles in churches and other ministry organisations. Engage in the study of the primary texts of the Christian faith (Old and New Testaments) with reflection on how those texts have been interpreted both historically and in contemporary readings.

Master of Arts

The Master of Arts is a flexible postgraduate qualification with opportunities to specialise in Chaplaincy, Counselling, or Christian Studies, in addition to a wide range of electives offered by AC. The research and writing skills gained will be applicable to most workplaces including, but not limited to, churches and not-for-profit organisations. The Master of Arts can also be a pathway towards further research and doctoral studies.

Graduate Diploma of Counselling

The Graduate Diploma of Counselling will teach you the technical and theoretical aspects of professional counselling, integrated with a Christian worldview. This course has an emphasis on vocational readiness and will teach you to apply counselling skills with integrity and professionalism. The units from this course can be used for credit towards the Masters-level counselling degree.

Master of Teaching (Primary)

The Master of Teaching (Primary) is a course designed to meet the Australian Professional Standards for teachers at a graduate teacher level, equipping graduates for provisional registration as generalist teachers from preparatory to Year 6. This course is grounded in evidence-based practice and contemporary theory and prepares graduates to teach across the full range of primary curriculum.

Master of Counselling

The Master of Counselling is designed to produce graduates who can apply integrated technical and theoretical concepts in a counselling context from a Christian worldview, as well as embody integrity, professional knowledge, and social skills, making a positive contribution to society. There is a strong emphasis on professional and vocational application. This course is accredited by the Australian Counselling Association (ACA).

Master of Teaching (Secondary)

The Master of Teaching (Secondary) is a course designed to meet the Australian Professional Standards for teachers at a graduate teacher level, equipping graduates for provisional registration as generalist teachers in high school. Designed for aspiring teachers and career changers who already have a degree, the Master of Teaching (Secondary) prepares you to teach in Independent and Public Secondary Schools. This fully accredited course provides a core of pedagogy and professional experience, while grounding you in a comprehensive understanding of the curriculum of your teaching area of specialisation.

Master of Theology

The Master of Theology provides a unique opportunity to engage in innovative research and critical exploration of contemporary issues. You can specialise in Biblical Studies, Theology or Christian History. You will be trained to communicate complex ideas and propose solutions to a wide audience, as well as design and implement an advanced research thesis. Your research can prepare you for ministry and leadership roles $% \left\{ 1,2,\ldots ,n\right\}$ in church, academic, and community settings. It is also a potential pathway to doctoral studies (PhD).

Research will identify, investigate, and address an issue within the field of Theology, Business, and/or Education, which will make an original contribution toward learning and professional practice within their chosen field.

The PhD course equips candidates to make substantial contributions toward the advancement of knowledge and practice within your chosen field and in the broader community. Our exceptional supervisors include many of the world's leading scholars in their fields. While developing skills in independent research, there are also many opportunities for connection and interaction. Candidates will join a vibrant research culture which is closely engaged with industry, professional, and scholarly networks across Australia and beyond.

FAQs & Pathways



What are the entry requirements?

International Students must provide evidence of English Language Proficiency — IELTS or equivalent. The minimum IELTS or equivalent score required differs by award so check the course pages on our website for details. International Students may be exempt from submitting an English Proficiency score if they are citizens of Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa, United Kingdom or United States of America or if they have completed a Certificate IV or higher course within the last 2 years in Australia.

Applicants admitted on the basis of their recent secondary education into a bachelor level course must demonstrate the completion of the International Baccalaureate or interstate or overseas equivalent qualification and result of 65 or higher.

Postgraduate studies require the completion of an AQF level 7 Bachelor degree or higher, each award having its own unique entry requirements.



How do I finance my study?

International students are required to pay an Enrolment Fee of \$200 and must submit their first semester's tuition in full to obtain a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). Payments can be made by direct debit or BPOINT. International students are required to demonstrate their financial capacity to support their study in Australia as part of the "Genuine Temporary Entrant" requirements. Following GTE clearance, students will be provided approval to remit their initial tuition fees.



Is it possible to study part-time?

International Students must study full-time to adhere with their visa requirements.

Pathways

We offer many pathways for you to start, progress or complete your studies to get to your destination.

For example, if you don't meet the entry requirements or are not sure about committing to a 3-year Bachelor degree, you can start with a 1-year Diploma, then decide after your 1st year whether to progress further. You can do the same with Postgraduate study — working up from a Graduate Certificate to a Masters. Our pathways give you flexible entry and exit options — talk to us to find out what suits you best!

What are the delivery modes?

International students are required to study on-campus in line with the conditions of their student visa. On-campus study will involve a combination of lectures and tutorials, with some programs offering practical industry placements. These requirements will vary based on the unit of study.

When can I start my studies?

AC offers two main intakes a year — Semester 1 starting in March and Semester 2 starting in August, each running for 13 weeks with a 2 week mid-semester break. Some courses, such as Education, begin their classes in February and July respectively. There are also subjects being delivered as pre-semester intensives outside of these periods.

All students, staff, and alumni are welcome to join us for our weekly chapel services. Chapel is usually followed by a free lunch and is a great opportunity for students to build new friendships.




WELLBEING CENTRE
