COURSE OVERVIEW

The Graduate Certificate in Coaching and Mentoring is designed to develop highly effective coaches and mentors who can support others to flourish personally, professionally, and spiritually. In today's complex and fast-changing professional environments, coaching and mentoring are recognised as powerful approaches for developing capability, strengthening resilience, and building sustainable leadership capacity.

This program integrates evidence-based practices drawn from psychology, leadership theory, adult learning, and organisational development, and thoughtfully contextualises them within a biblical perspective. Students engage with both theory and practice, developing ethical, relational, and contextually responsive coaching and mentoring approaches that are biblically informed.

Through reflective practice, skill development, and applied learning, students cultivate self-awareness, critical reflection, and advanced interpersonal skills. Graduates will be equipped to build trust, facilitate purposeful dialogue, and empower individuals and teams towards meaningful growth, transformation, and vocational effectiveness.
